This report outlines success in areas of academic and co-curricular enrichment.

Senior School

History

Olivia Cooper and Max Marlow (both L6RM) successfully completed the 'Lessons from Auschwitz' Project run by the Holocaust Educational Trust. They are both now Holocaust Educational Trust Ambassadors.

Evie Leigh was interviewed by telephone for the Jewish Telegraph about her links with the Holocaust survivor who died earlier this year.

Mathematics

In the UK Junior Maths Challenge for Year 7 and 8, pupils achieved 9 Gold, 9 Silver, and 17 Bronze Awards. Five pupils qualified for the Junior Kangaroo; Joyel George, Sanjay Sriram, Edward King, Sanaathanie Athiththan, and Thivyaa Rahulan. One pupil, Liam Vernon, qualified for the highest next round competition (the Maths Olympiad).
